A. Discussion Item: Men's mental health, partner with the Well to coordinate event to raise awareness Guest: Director of The Well - Christina Hammans (or designee)

- Christina invites all members to visit the well, and passed out flyers with information on the Well.
- Christina gives brief history on how the well was created and why it was created.
- The well has had 30,000 visits since it was opened.
- The well collaborated with on campus and off campus organizations like the Wrec and local therapy programs.
- Christina suggested we collaborate on a workshop: Santamaria volunteers
- The well will have a new counselor Bianca from the Wellcat Counselling Center.
- Miranda asked if there is a way to track how many students visit the well: Christina 175 visits a day, they also use cats connect to collect only Male or Female demographics data.
- Partida suggested an off-hour event in collaboration with Men of Chico at The Well.
- The well has an Instagram page, Christina asked us to give suggestions to grow their page.
- Santamaria mentioned that one of the places to promote men's mental health would be at the gym.

Tasha Alexander (International Wildcats) and Akylai Murzakulova

- Tasha: Informs us that work with international students starts with a prearrival invitation before
 international students get here, then an orientation during wildcat welcome week to get them acclimated
 to the new environment.
- There are currently 284 international students from 30 different countries mainly India, Kuwait, South Korea, Japan.
- Main job is to make the students feel comfortable, demystifying the new experience
- We need to make the students try out different resources around campus.
 Akylai:
- Talked about the Global Students Society(GSS), which creates events for international students and noninternational students, they focus on small events for each culture like lunar new year, Eid al-Fitr, prom dances...
- She also mentioned International Wildcat Program: English conversation hour open to all students, which to help international students practice their English speaking skills
- Akylai: mentioned the Wildcat program: for example Halloween pumpkin patch, potluck, bon voyage
- Tasha: Global Allies: open to all students to volunteer in the events mentioned above, might collaborate with CAVE
- Kendra mentioned Katey VonMosch from CAVE, Partida will connect Tasha with Katie
- Tasha, asked us to make conversation with international students and make friends, and make them feel welcome
