## VI. BUSINESS

A. Information Item: Change in Supplemental admission criteria in School of Nursing – Three presenters from Chico State Nursing Dept. - Fay Mitchell-Brown, Candice Sawyer, and Elizabeth Kimerek. They presented on how they want to change admission criteria for the nursing program and how it needs to be approved by the Chancellor office. So part of working towards that is presenting on campus and getting feedback. Changes relate around being more holistic and less academic based. They provided data on the current students and the current problems the system in place creates. Proposed changes include switching the academic test TEAS for the situational judgement test Casper. As well as changes in increments in other categories. Positive feedback especially with more priority being given to local and current students. After presentation they left the meeting.

B. Discussion Item: Sole trainings for being a recognized organization - Farlow shared that some of her clubs are experiencing challenges with SOLE. Villani spoke with council and they shared that they were having the same issues, Arce also shared that the club recognition process has been really challenging, especially presidents meeting, Farlow proposed that some training be offered during AS training to help support clubs as senators. Sullivan agreed.
