Regarding the B-Line, Gowda mentioned students are having issues with the B-Line who are missing classes because of the inconsistent schedules that are posted online. Pandit mentioned there are inconsistencies when it comes to schedules posted online versus the official B-Line website. She also mentioned there may be a lack of communication between the B-Line and the student body, as many did not know of newly added features, such as live schedules and bus tracking. Gowda mentioned faculty had reached out to her and brought up the idea of Wildcat Wednesdays, where students can wear school spirit wear on Wednesdays to help foster a sense of community and help students feel more connected to campus. Moving to the topic of graduate student challenges, Pandit mentioned that some students have trouble talking with potential employers at career fairs, as not all areas of the College of ECC are represented well. She mentioned students would like more companies related to software development would be present at said career fairs. Pandit mentioned she felt some graduate students have trouble finding mental health resources and feel intimidated to use them. Partida mentioned that as a graduate student, he feels there isn't enough time to be involved on campus and that most simply attend class and work a full-time job. He also mentioned that he would like for there to be a transition team of sorts for graduate students who are new to campus to help them get connected and feel welcomed.
